

**Proceedings of the weekly paddy procurement review  
meeting held on 08.9.2015 at 3.00 PM in the Conference Hall  
of FS&CW Department**

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No.18572 Dt.16.9.15.

The weekly paddy procurement review meeting was held under the Chairmanship of Commissioner-cum-Secretary, FS&CW Department on 08<sup>th</sup> September, 2015 at 3.00 P.M. in the Conference Hall of FS&CW Department. The following members/ their representatives were present in the meeting.

Initiating the discussion, Commissioner-cum-Secretary, FS&CW Deptt. told that at present Odisha, being a DCP State, is procuring around 45 to 55 Lakh MT of paddy directly from farmers by engaging State Agencies. The requirement of State under TPDS is around 20 Lakh MT per year. The OSCSC Ltd. is the only agency which is accepting CMR on behalf of State Government. The same agency is managing the storage and further distributing under TPDS. The Food Corporation of India (FCI) in the State accepts surplus rice from Millers on behalf of OSCSC and other State agencies. It arranges to dispatch rice to needy States for PDS.

1. **Review on Procurement of paddy and delivery of rice for KMS 2014-15**

Till 30-06-2015, **52,45,391MT** of paddy has been procured by six Agencies and through Levy route. The following table shows the Agency wise procurement of paddy and delivery of rice (CMR) as on 08.9.2015.

(A) **Performance:** The overall procurement is **25%** higher compared to last year. But it varies across districts with a few districts recording negative growth.

**39,790 MT & 26,806 MT** of CMR have been delivered to RRCs & FCI depots respectively during the last two weeks. This is way below the average fortnightly delivery. As far as overall rice delivery to FCI is concerned, it is **1389201 MT** against last year's **866880 MT**, i.e. an increase of **60%** over last year. To further expedite delivery of rice to FCI in the western region of Odisha, it is proposed that 5000 MT of CWC godown at Junagarh may be hired by FCI. MD, OSCSC and RMC, CWC were advised to visit Kalahandi on 14.9.2015 for the purpose. Total rice delivery as on date stands at **2744564 MT** which is about **76%** of the CMR due leaving a balance of 8 lakh MTs of CMR to be received. OSCSC alone has delivered a total of 2583691 MT of rice out of CMR due i.e. 3375482MT. Govt. of India has extended the period for delivery of Custom Milled Rice/Levy rice of Kharif and Rabi Season into the Central Pool for KMS 2014-15 upto 31.10.2015.

(B) **Review at District Level:** Collectors need to hold regular review meetings on procurement and PDS and send proceedings of such meetings to Government for reference and record.

**(C) Preparations for Kharif 2015-16**

Kharif 2015-16 will be upon us shortly. Procurement plans of State agencies have been sent to District Collectors concerned for inclusion in their district plan and for necessary feedback. A reminder may be given to concerned Collectors for getting their feedback. Food and Procurement Policy

for the coming KMS 2015-16 need be prepared for approval by Hon'ble Cabinet.

Online status of farmers' registration as on 08.9.2015 shows that 105763 no. of new farmers have registered for the first time and 475892 no. of farmers renewed their registration in 2403 no. of societies with a view to selling paddy this coming Kharif season. The progress of registration in districts like Bargarh, Ganjam, Khurda, Nawarangpur, Rayagada and Nayagarh is poor. RCS, Odisha and Collectors of concerned district are to expedite the work. A letter has been sent in this regard. Considering the low progress in some districts it was decided that the period of registration should be extended till 16.9.2015. Collectors and all other authorities concerned may be intimated accordingly.

2. **Review on Procurement of paddy and delivery of rice for KMS 2013-14**

**42.00** lakh MT of paddy equivalent to 28.36 lakh MT rice was procured in KMS 2013-14. Out of this, FCI has received 10.91 Lakh MT of CMR and OSCSC has received 1715974 MT making a total receipt of 2807899 MT. This leaves a balance of about 25629 MT of rice to be received from the Millers by OSCSC.

The list of thirty one (31) defaulting millers during KMS 2013-14 with action taken against them is at **Annexure-1**. All cases of culpable default shall be booked for criminal liability and FIRs filed in concerned Police Station. Further, all cases shall be covered under OPDR Act for recovery of dues. MD, OSCSC is required to follow up the matter. As the last date for delivery of CMR for KMS 2013-14 was 31.07.2015, no CMR shall be received any more. Cost of balance paddy has to be paid by millers in terms of cash.

**Status of claims pending with Insurer**

**Claims on account of Phailin 2013:** Out of 233 claims, 141 cases have been settled for Rs.1255.52 lakh. 86 claims were settled for Rs.Nil. Two cases i.e. Anjanaya Rice Mill and Bidhudutta Rice Mill of Ganjam are yet to be settled.

National Insurance Company, the insurer, will issue formal engagement orders in favour of surveyors in above two cases.

Out of 86 nil settlement cases, 4 millers of Ganjam have represented for reconsideration. The Company has agreed to reconsider.

**Flood of August, 2014:** Out of 24 cases (Sambalpur-22 and Deogarh-2), the insurer has settled 17 cases. 5 are pending which will be settled within 10 days.

The settlement of MSB Foods, Subarnapur's claim has been inordinately delayed.

**Other damage:** The claim of damage by fire to Laxmi Modern Rice Mill, Balasore shall be settled by 15.8.2015 and that of Sairam Rice Mill due to whirlwind will be settled in two months' time, as committed by the Company. MD may take a follow up meeting with Insurance Company and inform about the progress.

### **3. Evacuation of Rice from Surplus to Deficit District:**

OSCSC should workout PDS needs of districts along with an analysis of availability of CMR in the district to find out deficit/surplus position and put in place a plan for movement for rice from surplus district to deficit ones. Stocks in the RRCs of surplus districts should be regularly evacuated to facilitate receipt of CMR from Millers.

**a) FIFO principle in evacuation of rice:** While lifting rice, age of the stock should be considered and older stock should be despatched first. Where this prescribed norm is being violated, officers responsible for lapses should be called upon to explain in view of frequent reports of infractions being received from districts. MD, OSCSC told that he has impressed upon the Depot-in-Charges accordingly. It was reported that 7458.266 of CMR of KMS 2013-14 are available in six districts as per **Annexure-2**. MD should ensure that they are liquidated within 30.9.2015 positively. Kalahandi stocks should however be liquidated within September'15. GM (Proc.) needs to recast the figures for 2013-14 CMR available in various depots.

New SMS format has been prescribed to Depot in-charge to capture KMS-wise age of the stock being received and issued. 210 out of 264 Depots (RRCs) are reporting their transactions through SMS. GM (Proc) to pursue the matter directly with rest defaulting Depot-in-charges to ensure compliance.

Some depots are showing negative closing balance in Food Odisha Portal. It means that SMSs are not being sent regularly and there is lackadaisical implementation of mobile governance application. Each inflow to and outflow from the depot should be reported through SMS. This is not happening. Collectors are requested to discuss this issue with officers

concerned and take steps for removing the anomaly of depots showing negative closing balance.

**Plan for delivery to FCI & Evacuation by FCI.**

During review, it was found that **1362393**MT of CMR has been received by FCI in the current KMS till 08.9.2015. GM, FCI informed that utilisation of Storage space is 86.6%. Stock position of FCI as on date is as under:

FCI, Odisha has planned to evacuate 1,30,000 MT (Raw:-10,000 MT and Boiled:-1,20,000 MT) of rice and induct 40,000 MT of wheat into the State in August 2015. The State Government, however, wants more evacuation of rice from Odisha. State RRCs are full and evacuation by FCI will ease pressure on our storage. Commissioner-cum-Secretary has also moved FCI Headquarters, New Delhi requesting to evacuate 1.5 Lakh MT of boiled rice from the State every month in coming 3 months. Union Food Secretary has also been moved in this regard.

The following table shows the month-wise Receipt and Evacuation of CMR by FCI for the last KMS & current KMS.

Commissioner-cum-Secretary asked GM FCI to receive as much rice as possible. The district target should be treated as the minimum norm and there is no upper limit for delivery to FCI.

The above table would reveal that the State average of rice delivery for OSCSC so far is 77%. Boudh is at the bottom with 63%. Gajapati and Kandhamal have delivered 100% CMR. Nuapada and Malkangiri are at more

than 95% CSOs need to keep watch on delivery of CMR on a daily basis. All Millers with performance below 50% should be asked by MD, OSCSC to perform better or face action. Collectors may consider shifting paddy from non-performing mills to better performing mills in case where there is no improvement after repeated warnings. Name along with mobile number of Authorized Officers of such non-performing mills (delivery below 40% CMR due) was to be sent to FS&CW Deptt. by Collectors. Only CSO, Malkanagiri has reported on this. MD, OSCSC has called for written explanation from some individual Authorised Officers for poor delivery of CMR of Mills under their charge. He may send draft charges against the errant ones if explanation is found unsatisfactory.

The progress of PEG godowns at the following places was discussed. The status is as under:

**Dhenkanal**: - The 5000 MTC godown project has been completed and become functional. Godown utilized by OSCSC on 07.9.2015.

**Kendrapara**: - Only internal road work is left to be completed which is going on. It is expected to be operationalised by 01.10.2015.

**Angul**: - Project report received as informed by RM, CWC. By 17.07.2015 it will be sent to OSWC for approval. Tender to be invited. CWC to expedite the matter.

**Puri**: - For Puri a godown of 2500 MT has been proposed at Sakhigopal and rest 2500 is to be surrendered to GOI. Project report has been submitted to Kolkata office of CWC.

**Anandpur**: - Work order has been issued for this 10,500 MTC godown.

**Kutra & Ujalpur**: - Technical Bid opened on 19.08.2015 and sent to CWC Headquarters for approval to open the price bid.

**Balasure:** - Work order has already been issued but till date work not started as CWC is awaiting clearance of Forest Deptt. D.F.O. RM, CWC has deposited 2.3 lakh towards cost of removal of 104 no. of trees with DFO, Balasure.

The submission of bills by OSCSC amounts to Rs.**113.05** crore and sanction of funds by FCI was Rs.**185.97** crore during the last two weeks.

The State agencies are left with substantial amounts of unpaid bills for CMR delivered to FCI. OSCSC alone has more than Rs.767 crore of pending bills. For the State PSU, it means blockage of enormous funds and additional interest burden as it makes procurement by paying upfront through money borrowed from Banks. FCI, Odisha Region was requested to get its act together and meet the unpaid demands of Agencies quickly.

OSCSC needs to submit bills every week for CMR delivered to FCI. There should not be any slowdown in this regard.

**PEG Rentals:** Commissioner-cum-Secretary observed that PEG rentals of OSCSC need to be settled by FCI as the State PSU has paid Rs. 5.5 Cr. upfront to CWC. AGM, FCI told that the matter has been taken up with Head office and is expected to be sorted out soon.

### **Miller's Issues**

### **8. Miscellaneous Issues:**

i. ***Normative Milling Charges:*** So far data in respect of 11 millers has been sent to Tariff Commission. Four millers as noted below are unwilling to provide data in prescribed Proforma.

1. Laxminarayan Agro Food, Dhenkanal
2. Kalika Agro Products, Mayurbhanj
3. R.K Modern Raw & Boiled Rice mill, Kalahandi
4. Dugra Rice Mill, Kalahandi

MD, OSCSC was to furnish a list of fresh 4 parboiled mills in consultation with AORMA for furnishing data to Tariff Commission. The representative of AORMA was requested to submit within a week such list failing which MD will be at liberty to prepare the list of names of mills. But till date, the names of 4 millers have not been furnished.

ii. **P-PAS:** Government have taken a decision for direct payment to farmers through Digital Signature Certificates (DSCs) during 2015-16 through P-PAS which is going to be implemented in all PACS in 160 Blocks (including 60 where previously operationalized) under 30 districts. In this connection 879 nos. of DSC is required for 879 nos. of PACS to facilitate direct fund transfer to the Bank account of farmers during paddy procurement. 551 DSCs have previously been procured.

DSC could not be used in the just concluded Rabi Season as there was problem in their integration with P-PAS software. A meeting may be called by RCS, Odisha to resolve the issue in consultation with all stakeholders. OMEGA team to follow it up and report progress.
